The meeting commenced at 2.45p.m.

The Mayor Cllr. T. Fleming took the Chair.

Vote of Sympathy

Members Duty under Ethics Legislation

The Mayor said that he wished to remind members of their requirements under Part 15 (Ethics Framework) of the Local Government Act 2001 and the Code of Conduct for Councillors. Councillors should be aware that the onus for complying with the requirements of the Act and the Code of Conduct lies with each individual Councillor. He reminded Councillors that under the beneficial interest provision and should that provision apply, a Councillor must

- (1) Disclose the nature of his/her interest or the fact of a connected person's interest at the meeting and before discussion or consideration of the matter commences and
- (2) Withdraw from the meeting for so long as the matter is being discussed or considered, and accordingly, he/she shall take no part in the discussion or consideration of the matter and shall refrain from voting in relation to it.

08.12.19.01 Manager's Report on submissions/observations received on the Draft County Development Plan 2009-2015

Mr. T. Sheehy, SE Planning, informed the meeting that he would deal with protected structures first and he referred members to the list of submissions received which was circulated (attached). He informed members that following the holding of a round of electoral area meetings he understood that the submissions marked green on the list circulated represented the submissions where members were in agreement with the recommendations in the Manager's Report while there was no agreement on the submissions marked red. Mr. Sheehy said that he would firstly list the agreed submissions and if members had a difficulty with any of them they should indicate this as he listed them.

Mr. M. McMahon, Director of Planning, informed the meeting that the Manager's Report makes recommendations on all submissions received. The first exercise is to list the submissions where members agree with the recommendations in the Manager's Report. If members do not agree they should indicate this as Mr. Sheehy lists the agreed submissions. Then the submissions where members are not in agreement with the recommendations in the Manager's Report would be dealt with. Following this members may make their own proposals.

Submission No. 1 – Joseph O'Flaherty

Mr. T. Sheehy referred to Submission No. 1 from Mr. Joseph O'Flaherty and said that Mr. O'Flaherty has indicated that he does not want his property added to the Record of Protected Structures. He intends to maintain the character of the house and to replace the concrete roof over the porch with a slate roof. Mr. Sheehy stated that having subsequently examined this structure he was in agreement that it could be removed from the Record of Protected Structures.

Cllr. S. Fitzgerald PROPOSED that this structure be removed from the Record of Protected Structures.

Cllr. M. O'Shea SECONDED this proposal.

Mr. G. O'Brien, A/SEO, informed members that a vote would then be taken on the following proposal:-

On the PROPOSAL of Cllr. S. Fitzgerald, SECONDED by Cllr. M. The Mayor declared the resolution carried.

Submission No. 68 - Michael O'Shea MCC

Mr. T. Sheehy informed members that this submission objects to the proposed inclusion of the old spout structure in the Record of Protected Structures. The community requests that it be restored to its original condition. Mr. Sheehy said that this forms an appealing if unassuming feature in the street scene. The water pump remains of particular importance as a reminder of the mechanisms installed for the provision of water from a local source before the introduction of mains systems.

Cllr. M. O'Shea said that this is not the original pump but was put there in the 70's by the local community. There was an old hand pump at this location and the local community would like to restore it. However, if it is listed this will not be permitted. The local community feel that the spout should not be protected. He PROPOSED that this structure would not be listed.

Cllr. O'Donoghue SECONDED this proposal.

Mr. T. Sheehy said in the light of the arguments put forward by Cllr. O'Shea he accepted that it should not be listed.

Mr. G. O'Brien, A/SEO, informed members that a vote would then be taken on the following proposal:-

On the PROPOSAL of Cllr. M. O'Shea, SECONDED by Cllr. P. The Mayor declared the resolution carried.

Submission No. 78 – Eric Champ

Mr. T. Sheehy informed the meeting that this building is a well composed middle-size house of modest architectural aspirations, which retains many of the original details thereby making a positive contribution to the character of the area. The building has special architectural interest as it is an important element of the architectural heritage of the locality and makes a positive contribution to its setting. The house is of particular importance to the locality as it still retains its original use.

Cllr. C. Miller PROPOSED that this property would not be listed.

Cllr. P. O'Donoghue SECONDED this proposal.

Mr. T. Sheehy said that his Department's assessment was that a Section 57 Declaration could facilitate repairs to the structure. Officials from the Planning Department had meetings with the owner and they felt there was agreement that the building should be listed. He added that the Section 57 Declaration would allow for a lot of work to be carried out to the property and he believed that this property should be protected.

Cllr. C. Miller said that it is the wish of the Vestry that the building would not be listed and he had proposed this.

Cllr. M. O'Shea concurred with the sentiments expressed by Cllr. Miller and said that this buildings is of no historic importance. It is shabby and needs major remodelling. He added that this building has no significance in Milltown.

Cllr. J. O'Connor said that the people involved with this building are only caretakers of the property. If there was a change of use and the property was listed it would weaken their hand.

Cllr. B. Cronin asked what the architectural reasons for not listing this building were.

In response Cllr. C. Miller said that the owners feel that the listing of the building would restrict their options.

Cllr. M. Gleeson suggested that officials should meet with the owners and revert to the members following these discussions.

Mr. T. Sheehy informed members that staff from his Department met with the owners on a few occasions but they phoned that morning indicating that they did not want the building listed.

Cllr. C. Miller acknowledged that Mr. Sheehy and Mr. Fleming from the Planning Department had put a lot of work into this submission but said that the owners do not want the building listed.

Cllr. P. O'Donoghue said that he had every confidence in the Church of Ireland not to significantly alter the building and it should be left in their hands.

Mr. T. Curran, County Manager, asked members when considering the listing of a structure not to consider the wishes of the owners but to consider the need to protect the building.

Mr. G. O'Brien, A/SEO, informed members that a vote would then be taken on the following proposal:-

Submission No. 89 – Michael O'Sullivan
Submission No. 91 – Michelle Bennett RPS

Mr. T. Sheehy informed the meeting that Submission Nos. 89 and 91 would be taken together as they both refer to the Farmers House and he understood there was agreement that this property would not be added to the Record of Protected Structures.

Cllr. S. Fitzgerald PROPOSED that this building would not be added to the Record of Protected Structures.

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Cllr. C. Miller **SECONDED** this proposal.

Mr. G. O'Brien, A/SEO, informed members that a vote would then be taken on the following proposal:-

On the PROPOSAL of Cllr. S. Fitzgerald, **SECONDED** by Cllr. C. Miller, this Council having considered the County Manager's Report and Recommendations on submissions to the Draft Kerry County Development Plan 2009 – 2015 hereby resolves not to add the property the subject of Submission Nos. 89 and 91 to the Record of Protected Structures.

The Mayor declared the resolution carried.

Submission No. 95 – Celeste Slye

Mr. T. Sheehy informed members that this submission proposed the addition of six structures to the Record of Protected Structures. Members agreed that five of these could be listed but not the Farmers House. Now that the Farmers House has been removed from the Record of Protected Structures he understood that members agreed with the recommendations in the Manager's Report on this submission.

On the PROPOSAL of Cllr. S. Fitzgerald, **SECONDED** by Cllr. R. Beasley it was unanimously agreed to adopt the recommendations in the Manager's Report in relation to this submission with the exception of the recommendation regarding the Farmers House. (See previous vote)

Submission No. 13 – Tom McDonnell

Mr. T. Sheehy referred members to Pages 272 and 275 of the Manager's Report where details of this submission and the Manager's recommendations are set out. When the Kilgarvan Local Area Plan was being considered members voted to include this structure in the Record of Protected Structures. The appraisal of this property is as follows:- "This striking three bay three storey building has been included, due to its location and setting, its well composed façade, its height and scale; it has a dominating presence in the streetscape and is the most prominent

building in the village of Kilgarvan. This building clearly satisfies one of the architectural criteria for inclusion in the RPS ie. it makes a positive contribution to the streetscape and is the most significant architectural feature in the centre of Kilgarvan". Mr. Sheehy added that when the Kilgarvan Local Area Plan is revisited this property could be designated an 'opportunity site' and any replacement structure would be of equal standing. Mr. Sheehy accepted that in itself the building has no merit but he felt it should be protected. He now accepted that it would not be included in the Record of Protected Structures and that it would be designated an 'opportunity site' in the next Kilgarvan Local Area Plan.

Cllr. M. Gleeson said that he was aware there were ongoing discussions regarding this property. He viewed this structure and was impressed by it. He felt that the assessment of the structure in the Manager's Report was accurate. The building is aesthetically very pleasing and it enhances the village of Kilgarvan. He said that for the council now to say that the building should be replaced by a building of equal stature is a contradiction. In conclusion he PROPOSED that this building be protected.

Cllr. B. Cronin SECONDED this proposal. When the Kilgarvan Local Area Plan was being discussed there was a major debate about this property. He said that the assessment in the Manager's Report of the property is accurate. He added that this property is in the most prominent position as you drive through the village. The protection of this property was vigorously contested by the Planning Department when the Kilgarvan Local Area Plan was considered last February but now there is a total change. He referred to Page 358 of the Manager's Report and said that the decision not to protect The Rectory was a retrograde step as he was certain the building could be protected while improvements could be permitted.

Cllr. M. Healy-Rae said that as the local councillor in Kilgarvan he was well aware of the village and the importance of this site. He acknowledged that the Council should have control over this site but it should be designated an 'opportunity site'. The building itself is of no historic importance and is falling down. It does not meet the criteria necessary for a building to be protected. By designating the building it could mean that a development opportunity for this site and yard could be missed. He agreed that any proposed development would have to be sensitively dealt with. Cllr. M. Healy-Rae stated that this building is dangerous and he urged members to take the views of the local councillors on board. In conclusion he said that he would like to see a proper use of this important location.

Cllr. D. Healy-Rae said that this building is in a bad state of repair, there are no proper foundations and the walls are cracking. If the building is listed it will disintegrate. It is ideally located for a new development and he was opposed to listing it.

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Cllr. M. Connor-Scarteen said that many people feel this is a very impressive building in Kilgarvan and it is a landmark. He suggested that the façade should be retained.

Cllr. B. Cronin said that when the Kilgarvan Local Area Plan was being considered Cllr. Michael Healy-Rae presented photographs of this building and he said that the building was falling down. Cllr. Cronin asked Mr. Sheehy to clarify if this is the case, if the building is a significant danger or is it a fine structure.

Mr. T. Sheehy said that in his opinion the structure is not unstable and any existing defects can be rectified.

Cllr. M. Healy-Rae informed the meeting that one engineers report states that the building is structurally unsound. He PROPOSED that Mr. Sheehy's recommendation that this site be designated an 'opportunity site' be adopted.

Cllr. M. Gleeson PROPOSED that the building would be listed.

Mayor T. Fleming asked for clarification on the term 'Opportunity Site'.

In response Mr. T. Sheehy said there would be a specific brief for this building in relation to its size etc.

Mr. G. O'Brien, A/SEO, informed members that a vote would then be taken on the following proposal:-

On the PROPOSAL of Cllr. M. Gleeson SECONDED by Cllr. B. Cronin, this Council having considered the County Manager's Report and Recommendations on submissions to the Draft Kerry County Development Plan 2009 – 2015 hereby resolves to add RPS No. KY 094-005, the subject of Submission No. 13 from Tom McDonnell, Scartlee House, Loretto Road, Killarney, to the Record of Protected Structures.

The Mayor declared the resolution carried.

Submission No. 15 – Michael C. Daly BE on behalf of Michael Cronin

Mr. T. Sheehy informed the meeting that this submission refers to the Railway Goods Shed in Castlemaine and he read the appraisal into the record of the meeting: "The use of high quality materials and high levels of craftsmanship were the norm for most of the railway structures. The quality of the buildings was used to reflect the confidence of the railway companies in the new mode of transport. Brick, stone and cast iron were used to imaginative effect. So it is all the more important to regard the surviving buildings with respect and worthy of preservation. The structure retains most of the original detailing.

There are few extant remains of the Farranfore-Valentia line apart from this structure. It is considered important, not only from an architectural interest but also for social and historical reasons that this structure is maintained and preserved. While the structure has no current function, it may become feasible in the future, given adequate funding, to restore the building and make it available for either commercial or community use. It is considered that this structure should be included in the RPS because of it's special architectural, historical and social interest."

Cllr. M. O'Shea informed the meeting that this structure is falling down and is an eye sore. He believed there was no reason why it should be listed. The shed is 100 years old and he PROPOSED that it would not be listed.

Cllr. P. O'Donoghue SECONDED this proposal in view of the strong local sentiments expressed by Cllr. O'Shea.

Mr. T. Sheehy said that he disagreed with the members and said that a substantial portion of the roof structure is intact. If no action is taken the structure will deteriorate. This building is of architectural, social and historic interest to the people of Kerry as it represents an era when people invested in railways and had traditional ties to the railways. Grants are available for listed buildings and this could allow the roof to be restored. The loss of this building to the local community would be enormous. The land on which this shed is located is zoned for residential use and he was opposed to the zoning of it at the time. This is a golden opportunity for the developer to show good will and he strongly urged members to ensure that this building is protected.

Cllr. M. O'Shea said that the roof is gone and access to the building is through private property. He did not believe that the owner would apply for a grant to restore it. The railway is gone from this area since the '60's. It is not feasible to seek to preserve the building for tourism as access is through private property. If

the building is listed it will only result in the building being listed as a derelict site and levies imposed on the owner.

Cllr. M. Gleeson said that he disagreed with the views expressed by Cllr. O'Shea. One of the great achievements of the 19th century is the building of the railway lines. He added that he travelled through the tunnels and over the viaduct to Caherciveen as a young boy and he marvelled at what had been achieved. Many of the railway buildings, while they appear derelict, are actually superb structures. It was a mistake that some of the railway cottages were demolished and there is an obligation on members to ensure that the remaining ones are protected. He pointed out that access to Gallarus is also through private land. Cllr. Gleeson said that members owe it to future generations to protect this building and he believed it is an important structure.

Cllr. R. Beasley asked if this building is demolished what would replace it. If the funding is available to restore it he would support the protection of the building.

Cllr. M. O'Shea said that the county is full of dereliction. There was a lengthy discussion on the preservation of a building in Kilgarvan while officials said it could be knocked. The owner does not want to preserve this building in Castlemaine and access to it is over private land and he could not understand why it should be protected.

Cllr. T. Ferris pointed out that if the building is listed the owner can apply for grant aid.

Mr. T. Sheehy stated that none of the arguments made by Cllr. O'Shea are relevant. This is a golden opportunity to preserve this building and it is the correct thing to do in the long term. He understood that the owner does not intend to demolish it. This building is a social and cultural asset for the people of the area and those interested in railways. Members should consider what is the correct thing to do and not to give priority to the wishes of the owner.

Cllr. M. O'Shea said that the county is full of structures like this one which are falling down and the owners are issued with fines under the Derelict Sites Act. The people of Castlemaine do not want this building protected.

Mr. G. O'Brien, A/SEO, informed members that a vote would then be taken on the following proposal:-

Cllr. B. O'Connell SECONDED this proposal and it was unanimously agreed.

Submission No. 45 – John Duggan

Mr. T. Sheehy said that this building is located at the corner of Main Street, Ballyheigue and he read the appraisal of this building into the record of the meeting: "This building because of its size and corner location is a prominent structure and an important element of Main Street in Ballyheigue. This building clearly satisfies one of the architectural criteria for inclusion in the RPS i.e. it makes a positive contribution to the streetscape. It is considered that this structure has special architectural interest which warrants inclusion in the RPS."

Cllr. J. Brassil stated that he was opposed to the inclusion of this property in the Record of Protected Structures as the building is in a good condition. The owner carried out substantial work to the property in the past five years. He removed the plaster and pointed the stone. This building would not have come to the Council's attention if these works were not carried out. If the building was listed he would not have been permitted to do this work. This is a family home and given the commitment and work by the owner, who does not want this building listed, Cllr. Brassil PROPOSED that this building would not be listed.

Cllr. R. Beasley SECONDED this proposal.

Cllr. B. Cronin asked Mr. Sheehy for his response to the comments made by Cllr. Brassil.

Mr. T. Sheehy said that this is a striking building which is in very good condition. He added that the façade should be protected and a Section 57 Declaration could facilitate any works required.

Cllr. J. Brassil pointed out that when the Ballyheigue Local Area Plan was being considered several ring roads were proposed and this landowner accepted the advice of planners. The owners express wish is that the building would not be listed.

Cllr. R. Beasley said there is great credit due to the owner of this property for the work carried out to the building and members must support him.
