#### 1 INTRODUCTION

This report presents the results of an archaeological survey conducted at Killehenny Burial Ground, Ballybunion, Co. Kerry (NGR: 86311/139609) (Figure 1). The work was undertaken on behalf of Kerry County Council, in accordance with survey specifications provided by the client.

The report comprises a detailed survey including boundaries, location of paths and desire lines, gravemarkers, tombs, architectural fragments, remains of churches or buildings, dangerous areas of ground collapse and a photographic survey of headstones and gravemarkers linked back to survey drawings. Also included are written descriptions of buildings, cross-slabs and early enclosures; statements on the condition of buildings; suggested suitable/necessary remedial action that may be needed to secure these structures; breaches of the boundary walls, open or collapsed tombs and the condition of paths and entrance gates. A photographic survey of damaged and dangerous structures or features is also included.

#### 2 SITE DESCRIPTION AND LOCATION

Killehenny Graveyard (Plate 1) is located within the townlands Of Killehenny and Ballyeangh, Co. Kerry, situated approximately 1.6 km to the south of the town centre of Ballybunion. The graveyard is located adjacent to Ballybunion Golf Club and fronts directly onto a third class road to the east. Topographically, the area is relatively flat while sand dunes to the west obscure the view to the nearby coast. A notable rise in the landscape occurs approximately 5.6 km to the northeast where Knockanore Mountain, the highest mountain (267m) in the North Kerry region is clearly visible.

The graveyard is located on the eastern edge of a ridge of sand dunes that are located close to the coast. As a result the interior of the graveyard is undulated. The original plan of the graveyard was sub-oval, however a recent extension to the south has made the graveyard plan more rectangular. Examination of the OS First Edition 6" Map Sheet 04 (1841) portrays the boundaries of the graveyard as a dashed line within the townland of Ballyeagh. The graveyard is recorded in the Record of Monuments and Places (RMP) as KE004-043001. Within the graveyard is the site of a church (KE004-043) which is no longer visible at ground level.

The oldest grave recorded within the graveyard bears a date of 1791 and belongs to Grave No. 377.

#### 3 METHODOLOGY

The site survey was carried out on 13-18 May 2011 by a team of two surveyors.

An electronic survey was conducted on the Irish National Grid using a Trimble GPS& GLONASS R6 base and rover. The GPS was supplemented with a Leica TCR407 Total Station and Panasonic Toughbook Rugged Tablet PC with Penmap software when necessary due to tree cover and any resulting loss in GPS signal. All grave plots, gravemarkers, headstones and tombs were surveyed in plan as were any structural remains, boundary walls, openings, paths and desire lines. Finished survey files were exported to AutoCAD where final edits were made. A digital copy of the drawings is provided on DVD (Appendix 5).

Individual graves and/or associated markers or headstones were assigned a unique grave number on the digital survey whether the latter was being carried out using GPS or with a Total Station and Panasonic Toughbook. This unique grave number is also used to in to identify the individual graves within the database (see below).

The photographic elements of the survey were accomplished using a Canon Power Shot A650 IS digital camera. The camera was set to assign a consecutive sequence of unique photo numbers throughout the survey. These numbers were cross-referenced with unique database entries and in a hard copy photo register. The photographic survey encompassed all extant structures/remains, boundaries, entrance gates, damaged/dangerous structures or features as well as individual graves and grave furniture. All photographs are provided on DVD (Appendix 5).

All descriptive data relating to the survey was entered into a custom-designed Microsoft Access relational database, which comprises of four linked tables. One table relates to the graveyard, one to the individual graves within it and one to all other significant features surveyed within that graveyard; the final table is a register of all photographs. The database allows all relevant information for the graveyard (and its internal features) to be linked together; entries can also be queried by item type e.g. named and unnamed, tombs, headstone, gravemarker, miscellaneous. Appendices have been generated automatically from the database using filtered reports.

The descriptions throughout the database and within this report were compiled using standard National Inventory of Architectural Heritage (NIAH) terminology and methodology where suitable, with guidelines and techniques from other established UK and Irish government sources being respected throughout (RCHME 1996; DEHLG 2001; RCAHMS 2004; EH 2004 and 2006; NIAH 2006). In addition, terminology and methodology was cross referenced to standard texts of buildings archaeology and architectural history (Robertson 1990; Curl 1999; Morris 2000).

#### 4 THE RESULTS

#### 4.1 Boundaries

The boundary walls surrounding the historic area of the graveyard are of roughly dressed mortared rubblestone with rubble stone coping. They vary in height from 1.4 m to just under 2 m at the highest point to the north (Plates 1, 2, 3 & 4). For the most part the boundary survives in good condition, except for the south-western portion which is no longer extant and is now marked by a low grass covered bank with patches of stonework visible. This is partially due to a need to provide access to the graveyard extension. Some of the new graves in this extension are located on top of the remains of the boundary wall.

Roughcast rendered walls with render coping and square-profile piers enclose the graveyard extension (Plate 5, 6 & 7). Wall mounted plaques displaying the Stations of the Cross are located on the interior of the southern and eastern boundaries of the extension (Plate 6).

For the most part the walls appear stable with very little vegetation on their interior elevations. The occurrence of distinctive pale lichens are a frequent feature of the walls and compliment their charm and character.

#### Recommendations

Stabilise and partially restore the ruinous sections of the south-western area of the historic boundary. Any such works should use suitable materials and masonry techniques that are sympathetic to the historic character of the graveyard. Modern concrete blocks have been used to form a pier on this wall and their use should be avoided in future.

# 4.2 Entrance

The primary access to the historic section of the graveyard is through a pedestrian entrance which is located in the eastern boundary. The entrance comprises of a pair of dressed limestone gate-piers with roughly dressed rubble limestone capping (Plates 8 and 9). The timber battened gate is a more recent addition and displays a central Celtic Cross finial. Two other entrances are located within the graveyard extension and consist of a pedestrian entrance flanking a larger gated entrance. The latter consists of rendered gate-piers supporting a pair of double-leaf wrought-iron gates. This entrance gives vehicular access to the graveyard extension.

All the entrances are in good condition; however the larger gated entrance to the graveyard extension has surface rust.

#### Recommendations

The application of a rust inhibitor and paint would greatly improve the appearance of the entrance to the graveyard extension.

# 4.3 Pathways

There are a number of gravel pathways located in and around the plots within the graveyard extension (Plate 12). A single gravel path extends from the pedestrian entrance at the eastern

boundary to the graveyard extension and continues northwards ending at the northern-most point within the graveyard (Plate 13).

For the most part the gravel paths survive in good condition; however some weed growth is beginning to establish itself.

#### Recommendations

Remove and prevent further weed growth within the gravel paths. Removal of excessive grass growth on the plots within the graveyard extension will greatly enhance the visual appearance of the graveyard as people enter the site. Broadcast spraying of herbicides should be avoided as this can be damaging to the environment and local wildlife.

# 4.4 Desire lines

Desire lines are represented in abundance at Killehenny Graveyard, and are indicative of the frequency of visitors. For the most part these desire lines respect the graves, however some graves are partially crossed e.g. the plinth to tomb (Grave No. 155). The desire lines lead around and across the graveyard, with the majority of them commencing at the gravel path to the east. There are a number of junctions where the desire lines meet or cross (Plates 15, 16 and 17). One of the main desire lines leads from the main entrance westwards around the elaborate tomb (Grave No. 155) (Plate 14). There is also a desire line which starts along the inside of the ruined south-western boundary (Plate 15), before turning north and also passing the elaborate tomb (Grave No. 155).

# Recommendations

Transform some of the bigger desire lines into gravel paths and respect any graves that may have been truncated by them. This will prevent further damage and disturbance to the graveyard.

### 4.5 Named Tombs

There are 16 named tombs represented in Killehenny Graveyard. The majority of these date to the mid nineteenth century and are concentrated in the south-eastern area of the historic section of the graveyard.

Generally all of the tombs follow the same construction method and draw inspiration from neoclassical designs, a common theme in the graveyards of County Kerry. The majority are constructed from finely tooled stone, with limestone being the most common material. They commonly have unadorned tooled stone cornices which are capped by hipped stone roofs (Plate 15). There are some exceptions; the tomb at Grave No. 452 to the Creagh Family is distinguished by its use of cobbling to the hipped roof (Plate 16).

The most elaborate tomb within the graveyard is Grave No. 155 (Plate 17). This tomb is prominently located in the central area of the historic section of the graveyard. Magnificently constructed out of tooled limestone, this tomb is positioned on a large stepped platform which accentuates its prominence. The tomb itself has a cruciform shape in plan and features finely crafted moulded plinths and cornices. An exceptionally tooled doomed roof further distinguishes this tomb.

A large court is located to the front (east) of tomb (Grave No. 17). At over 1 m deep, this open court area creates a significant hazard given the amount of visitors to the graveyard.

The oldest identified tomb was Grave No. 49 which dated to 1827 (Plate 15).

For the most part, the tombs survive in very good condition, however on certain tombs, e.g. Grave No. 452, the cobble roof is in poor condition and weed growth is gradually establishing itself. Occasional cracks in the masonry work and loose pointing on the bedding planes are visible on some of the tombs.

#### Recommendations

Repointing of damaged areas of masonry work would improve the appearance and enhance the tombs resistance to the elements.

Any repointing of the walls should be carried out using the correct (lime) mortars with flush or recessed pointing which are sympathetic to the historic character of the graveyard. Ribbon pointing should be avoided as its use would damage the structures historic character.

Installing protective railing around the deep court to Grave No. 17 is a safety priority and will reduce the risk of injury.

#### 4.6 Unnamed Tombs

There are 2 unnamed tombs within Killehenny Graveyard, represented by Grave Nos. 146 and 105.

The first unnamed tomb (146) is located close to the south-western boundary. The tomb is unusually constructed and has a stepped profile (Plate 18). The tomb fabric consists of roughly dressed rubblestone walls with dressed stone flags forming capping to the steps. A large stone slab forms the tomb cap and this may once have been inscribed, but has since been eroded. This tomb is in poor condition; much of the masonry is loose and is becoming increasingly overgrown with grass and weeds.

The second tomb (105) is located in the central area of the graveyard to the west side of one of the main desire lines which commences at the eastern entrance (Plate 19). This tomb is quite an elaborate and is constructed from finely tooled limestone panels, which support a broken carved limestone cap. This tomb survives in reasonable condition, although some of the carved panels have moved slightly and the capstone is broken at the west end.

#### Recommendations

The presence of flower pots at the first unnamed tomb (Grave No. 146) suggests that the tomb was once tended and knowledge may exist of who is interred within the tomb. Local consultation may help in obtaining a name for the individual/individuals interred in this tomb.

Restoration of both of these tombs will insure their weather-proofing and enhance the general visual appeal of the graveyard.

Ay restoration works should use skills and material which are sympathetic to the historic character of the graveyard and are sympathetic to the design of the individual tombs.

# 4.7 Named Headstones and Plots

There are 334 named headstones and plots in the historic section of Killehenny Graveyard.

The majority of these are in good condition and mostly date to the nineteenth and twentieth centuries. The oldest inscribed headstone is at Grave No. 377 (Plates 20 and 21), commemorates 'Don, Kissane', and carries a date of 1791. This headstone is an unusual example; it is elaborately decorated with chevron motifs and ogham writing to the rear (west) elevation (Plate 22) above an inscribed Celtic Cross motif. Two other headstones at Grave Nos. 47 and 64 also date to the eighteenth century with dates of 1796 and 1795 respectively.

There are 50 headstones that are not associated with specific plots. There is great variation in the types of headstones that are present (both with and without plots). The most common are Celtic Cross forms, simple inscribed limestone uprights and modern polished marble and granites headstones of different designs. A common trend can be seen in relation to the construction of the plots; Early examples from the nineteenth and early twentieth centuries tend to have tooled limestone plinth walls which sometimes support cast and wrought railings. Later twentieth century and twenty-first century examples tend to have render or rendered plinth walls which towards the end of the twenty-first century tend to develop to polished limestone, granites and marble plinths. Most of the plots are either grass covered or have been recently sealed using render/concrete mixtures to produce a level internal area which is usually covered by gravel. Since the graveyard is situated on the eastern side of a ridge of sand dunes, some of the more recent burials within plots are noticeable for uncovered mounds of sand. There is also small number of horizontally laid headstones or ledger slabs.

Several other graves are of special interest. One fine example of a twentieth century plot (Grave No. 135) is of particular note due to its elaborate construction. As one of the largest plots within the graveyard, it commemorates members of the Fitzell, Griffin and Hennessy families (Plate 23). A finely carved limestone Celtic Cross headstone with carved decorative panels is further enhanced through the use of paintwork to highlight the artwork. Further ornamentation is present on the footstone which depicts a coloured screen of Da Vinci's famous painting 'The Last Supper'.

Located the along the eastern side of the graveyard close to the entrance is an IRA memorial (Grave No. 453), which was erected by the North Kerry Republican Committee.

There are a limited number of broken or damaged headstones and plots, e.g. Grave No. 403, a modern plot commemorating the Perryman family where a second historic headstone (broken) has been placed on top.

There are is one World War 1 veteran buried within the graveyard; Grave No. 376 is that of William Costello, Illinois 1st SGT 14 Infantry. There are two grave from World War II; Grave No. 150 is of an 'RAF Soldier 2205876 Sergeant T. S. Diggin, Wireless Operator/Air Gunner, Royal Air Force 30th August 1944'. The second is Grave No. 393, in memory of Thomas C. O'Carroll, A.B.S.T DSSX-28087 Royal Navy H.M.S/M 'Syrtis' a submarine which was lost on patrol on 31st March 1944.

Another burial, Grave No. 422, is slightly illegible but is in memory of Constable Lynch 1858.

The named plot (Grave No. 84) commemorating the Carmody family is positioned on the crest of a small rise within the graveyard and is one of the more distinguished graves as the plot has become quite overgrown by large shrubbery.

#### Recommendations

Repair broken headstones and replace missing sections of railing on the affected plots. Remove weed growth on plots.

An application of a suitable rust inhibitor and fresh coat of paint should be applied to all the wrought and cast-iron railings on the various plots to prolong their life.

Maintenance of the overgrowth at Grave No. 84 will ensure that the headstone is accessible to visitors and ensure that the shrubbery does not extend beyond the plot.

# 4.8 Unnamed Headstones and Plots

There are 16 unnamed or illegible headstones and plots present within Killehenny Graveyard. In particular Grave No. 51 consisted of a low earthen mound which was unmarked except for a recent small vase of flowers indicating the presence of a burial. The headstone at Grave No. 239 was inscribed; however this has become illegible although the numbers '184\_' may represent a date for this headstone. The majority of the remaining unnamed plots are grass covered.

#### Recommendations

General maintenance of the headstones and plots.

# 4.9 Named Gravemarkers

Three named gravemarkers were recorded within Killehenny Graveyard. Grave No. 24 consists of an iron cross which commemorates the Nolan Family (Plate 25). The remaining two gravemarkers, at Grave Nos. 50 and 462, are wooden crosses and commemorate the Houlihan and O'Connell families.

#### 4.10 Unnamed Gravemarkers

In total 98 unnamed gravemarkers were recorded within Killehenny Graveyard. The majority of these are scattered throughout the graveyard and generally consist of simple thin slabs of locally sourced stone, which were placed in the ground e.g. Grave No. 13 (Plate 26). For the most part they were all in good condition although several appear to have fallen over, e.g. Grave No. 121.

Other materials were used as gravemarkers included wrought-iron crosses, e.g. Grave No. 26.

Located in the north-western quadrant of the graveyard is an unusual gravemarker (Grave No. 470). This stone consists of a possible saddle quern which had an inscribed cross on the rear (west) elevation (also recorded as Miscellaneous No. 03).

# Recommendations

Continued maintenance of the grass in the interior of the graveyard will ensure that these graves have greater visibility which will provide greater safety while walking.

Measures should be taken with regard to the construction of any new plots within the historic area of the graveyard, to ensure that these do not have any impact on existing gravemarkers. In addition due care should be taken with any works around existing headstones/plots as there is the possibility that further gravemarkers will be uncovered.

#### 4.11 Miscellaneous Items

# 4.11(i) Inscribed Cross Slab

*Miscellaneous No. 03:* A possible saddle quern is located in the north-western quadrant of the graveyard. This gravemarker also had an inscribed cross on the rear (west) elevation (Plates 27 and 28). It also forms a gravemarker to Grave No. 470.

# 4.11(ii) Miscellaneous Items

Miscellaneous No. 01: Render Seat, possibly associated with one of the surrounding burials.

Miscellaneous No. 02: Render Seat, possibly associated with one of the surrounding burials.

Miscellaneous No. 04: Render Seat, possibly associated with one of the surrounding burials.

Miscellaneous No. 05: Render Seat, possibly associated with one of the surrounding burials.

# 5 SUMMARY OF RECOMMENDATIONS FOR FUTURE MANAGEMENT/CONSERVATION

The following recommendations are made in relation to the on-going and future management and conservation of the graveyard at Killehenny:

- Grass in the interior of the graveyard should be kept low to ensure that all gravemarkers remain visible.
- The installation of a barrier/net on the western side of the graveyard which faces the golf course would offer protection for the graveyard and graveyard visitors from misguided golf balls; during the survey a golf ball hit a headstone 2 m away from the survey team. This constitutes a serious health and safety risk. Any installation of such a barrier should also take into consideration the impacts on local wildlife.
- The use of broad spectrum weed killers should be avoided during the clearance of vegetation.
- The removal of grass and other deeply rooted vegetation should only be carried out under archaeological supervision to ensure that the full extent of any concealed burial markers and tombs may be exposed without damage.
- Domestic waste materials and rubbish should be removed from the site, and if fly tipping of graveyard debris becomes a persistent problem, preventative measures should be taken.
- A rust treatment and possibly a fresh coat of paint should be applied to the various iron crosses and plot railings to prevent further degradation.
- Measures should be taken to secure the south-western boundary from further collapse. This can be achieved through the control and monitoring of all attached vegetation and the repointing of the structure using appropriate (lime) mortars with flush or recessed pointing. Ribbon pointing must be avoided as its use would damage the structures historic character.
- Overgrown shrubbery on the graves should be maintained to reduce their impact on surrounding graves.
- Deep depressions and areas of sharp falls within the graveyard present serious health and safety issues and require immediate remedial action.
- The publication: The care and conservation of graveyards by the Office of Public Works should be consulted prior to carrying out of any maintenance work on the burial grounds or church.
- An information board presenting historical and archaeological information would make an excellent addition to the site.
- Prevention of any additional plots been claimed within the historic graveyard. This is a
  strong concern to the local community who do not want those buried within the graveyard to
  be intentionally disturbed. Even though the gravemarkers may be un-inscribed and there is
  no record of those interred, the erection of temporary plots over unmarked burials should be
  prohibited. There is also a high potential that unknown graves survive in the areas of these
  temporary plots.

Any proposed ground works should be monitored by a suitably qualified archaeologist.




Figure 2 - Killehenny Graveyard, Extract from OS 1st Edition 1846, Sheet 004




Figure 4 -Archaeological survey plan of Killehenny Graveyard, 2011.




Figure 4.1 -Archaeological survey plan of Killehenny Graveyard, 2011.
