SECTION 75 OF ROADS ACT 1993**

Notice is hereby given that, pursuant to Section 75 of the Roads Act 1993, and the Temporary Closing of Roads Regulations 1994, Kerry County Council **has decided** to close to public traffic the following road:

**Road Closed:** L-1008 Local Road will be closed for approximately 2.1 km, from Ballydonoghue (near St. Teresa's Church) to the junction at Knockenagh North and Gunsborough.

Please note: The actual works area spans only 500 metres, but the full section will be closed to through traffic for safety and operational efficiency. Local access will be maintained from both ends of the closure.

**Road Closing Times:** Monday 30<sup>th</sup> March to Thursday 30<sup>th</sup> April 2026.

The purpose of this road closure is to facilitate the installation of power cable ducting from Drombeg Phase 1 Solar farm to Drombeg Phase 2 Solar farm & upgrade two sections of UE 460mm watermains.

**Diversions will be as follows and will be clearly signposted:**

Traffic travelling from Lisselton towards Coolard	Continue along the L-1006 through Ballydonoghue, passing St. Teresa's Church to the junction with the L-1008 at Ballydonoghue Church cross, at Ballydonoghue cross keep left on L-1006, continue along the L-1006 to the junction with the L-6019 at Coolbeha, take a right onto the L-6019, continue along the L-6019 to the junction with the L-1008 at Gunsboro cross.
Traffic travelling from Coolard to Lisselton:	Continue along the L-1008 to the junction with the L-6019 at Gunsboro cross, take a right onto the L-6019, continue along the L-6019 to the junction with the L-1006 at Coolbeha cross, take a left onto the L-1006, continue along the L-1006 to Ballydonoghue Church cross

Local access will be provided for emergency services and local residents.
